Wikipedia: The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ /ttʃ/ ITCH), known by sailors as the *doldrums* or the calms because of its monotonous windless weather, is the area where the northeast and the southeast trade winds converge. It encircles Earth near the thermal equator though its specific position varies seasonally. When it lies near the geographic Equator, it is called the near-equatorial trough. Where the ITCZ is drawn into and merges with a monsoonal circulation, it is sometimes referred to as a monsoon trough, a usage that is more common in Australia and parts of Asia.

While the above definition of the doldrums explains its origin, that is not what most of us (not being sailors, after all) think when we think about it. For me, and I would assume for you as well, it is the term used to describe the kind of weather we have been having—hot and humid. It makes us want to hide in a air conditioned area, saps the energy right out of the body to do any manual labor (mowing the

grass, for example) and makes us wish for cooler (even cold) weather.

And yet, when the cold weather arrives and the snow is falling outside the windows the reverse happens—we wish for warm weather. It is this paradox that is the difference between human beings and our favorite friends from the animal kingdom. The sleeping part can be interesting to watch as they both seek the coolest and most comfortable place. Fortunately their personalities are very different so each likes different places.

I believe that the same argument can be made for people. Each of us develops different likes and dislikes. Yet church is a community of many people with different likes and dislikes. It is a successful community when we all can share those parts of life where we like the same things and can respect and accept those parts of life where we do not share the same things. God accepts us all and asks for us to accept each other as well.

TRUSTEES

Hey everyone, the Trustees have decided after putting in numerous hours trying to clean the deck completely of paint that we will stain the deck white again instead of clear. There are several spindles that are too close to the posts, and make it impossible to chip without taking parts of the deck apart. Also, there is paint inside of numerous cracks in the wood, and in every nail hole, which would take far too much time to clean out. If we stained it clear, all of these issues would show. I believe after getting it power washed, stripping close to 99 percent of it and sanding it thoroughly, this deck stain will give us at least ten years without much wear. There will be extra stain to touch up any problem areas in the coming years. I will be staining the deck Saturday, and it requires two coats. I do ask for no one to walk on it from Saturday until Monday. I will make an announcement in church and have cones up as well with a sign. We had our plumber Joe clean out our oven and replace the ignitor switch. The oven now starts with the ignition button rather than using a lighter to start the pilot. He also replaced a hose on our dehumidifier that was clogged, which was causing the dehumidifier to fill up and stop running. I will have an S.O.P in the kitchen for how to start the oven in case I am not at an event or funeral. Lastly, I bought a couple pieces for the downspout by the Little Shop door that was damaged a few years back. I will install that Saturday as well.
