Hey everyone, we have set up appointments for all general maintenance early this year to get it out of the way. Banner Water has confirmed that they will do an annual water test for us so we can safely have dinners, Holly Bazaar, and any other events involving food. We have also not extended our policy with Travelers to do our biannual water heater and boiler inspections as our new insurance company has provided us with a company they use through the insurance board. It was brought to my attention that doors in both buildings are being left unlocked. I have been much more mindful of making sure I lock doors as I leave the buildings as I am probably the biggest culprit! We ask everyone to be mindful, and double check before leaving Sunday. If you see any other doors unlocked in the future let me know so I can continue to make sure I am locking them when I visit. Secondly, when I visit the church to do my rounds, maintenance or meet with contractors I have noticed a lot of lights are being left on (specifically in the secretary's office of the Parish House, and in the Narthex of the church) in both buildings. The heat in Fellowship Hall has been left on many times as well. Since I don't turn on any lights or adjust the heat when I visit, the Trustees ask everyone who enters the buildings throughout the week, or if you're the last to leave on Sunday to make sure no lights are on, and the heat is turned down. We continue into the year to try and save the church money everywhere we can. Thank you very much!
