A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear members and friends of Second Congregational Church,

In terms of the calendar, this is a rather unique church year, for sure! Why am I saying this? Well.....Unlike most years, Easter will be arriving before we even get to the month of April. This year, we will be celebrating this wonderful feast on Sunday March 31, with Holy Week preceding it as it begins with Palm Sunday on March 24.

Now, what is important is that as we ready ourselves to celebrate the wonderful day known as Easter, what we also need to consider is that important week that comes before we are ready to break out the Easter eggs and candy! As you well know, what I am talking about here is HOLY WEEK.

I encourage you, if it at all possible, to consider participating in the services we will be offering during Holy Week and on Easter Sunday. Listed below is information about the Holy Week oppor-

tunities for worship during that significant week prior to Easter.

This includes the following:

- MARCH 24- PALM SUNDAY (also known as Palm/Passion Sunday)- Worship at 9:30 am- We will be receiving palms.
- Wednesday March 27---Holy Week prayer service on my Facebook page., which goes by Robert La-Rochelle.
- Thursday March 28- The TRIDUUM (The Three Days) begins with our Maundy Thursday service at church at 6 pm.
- Friday March 29- NOON- Good Friday worship at Stafford Springs Congregational Church. I will be delivering a message during the service. The service includes reflection on what are known as Jesus' 7 Last Words. Clergy from many different churches in Stafford will participate in this ecumenical
- Saturday March 30-A prayer service of about 15 minutes in length which will be posted on my Facebook page. This will be posted on HOLY SATURDAY morning.
- SUNDAY March 31- Our celebration of Easter Sunday in our church!

Now, if you do NOT access Facebook, you will be able to participate by getting printed copies of the services that are available online during Holy Week. You can receive a PRINTED COPY of the service and you can use that copy as a resource for prayer at home. Those materials will be available as we draw closer to the specific dates.

As we join together for worship during this Lenten season, we look forward to that outbreak of joy which is so integral to the experience of Easter. As we prepare for those days, may we seek to do our best to immerse ourselves in the reality of LENT. We do so through reading and reflecting on the Scriptures of the season. Suggested Bible readings are available in our worship bulletins as well as by checking out the postings on my Facebook page. May you find in these last few weeks of length varied ways to reflect on the meaning and purpose of this unique season, a season that leads us into the amazing and incredible JOY that goes by the name EASTER.

CHURCH COUNCIL

Church Council met on Tuesday evening the 21st at 6:30 and discussed numerous items the following are some of interest:

- Pastor Bob's report included his plans for the Lenten season with in person and online services.
- He has been meeting with members in person and / or phone or email.
- He has been pleased with attendance at the monthly educational program he offers.
- In the near future he will visit the Sunday School classes during worship.
- On March 3rd Rev. Isaac Lawson our conference minister will join us for worship.
- During Holy Week Bob will offer both online and in person services hope to see you all there.
- The treasurer reports he had to move money from invested funds to the check book to pay bills. This was necessitated by receiving the bill for our insurance for the annual amount of \$7000.00. The good news is we won't receive further bills for insurance until next year.
- He also reports all bill are current and paid and we have \$3021.29 in checking.
- The deacons discussed the fact that there are only 4 members so there is a possibility that there may only be 1 deacon present on a Sunday to serve. They have a contingence plan that would enable one deacon to cover the service. They could also ask a former deacon in the congregation to assist.
- It was mentioned that we may have a Saint Patrick's Day breakfast on Sunday March 17th, watch for details!!
- Trustees report that the boiler inspections for both buildings are complete.
- The water softener had its yearly maintenance.
- Exit signs emergency lights and smoke detectors were checked and those that had issues were addressed.
- Looking ahead food for thought; the parish roof is 24 years into a 25-year life and the parish furnace was installed in 1998 and has needed some repairs done for the last 3 years.
- Financial Secretary reports that so far in 2024 we have taken in \$3828.00 compared to the same period in 2023 when \$4909.98 was received.
- Christian Education committee reports they are looking to have a movie night sometime in March.
- Information on our summer camp Silver Lake was sent out as well as an email stating that the church would be interested in helping with some of the tuition for those children that might want to attend.
- Pastor Bob will be visiting classes on March 10th.
- In April they will be reaching out to shut-ins to see if anyone needs help spring clean up.
- They will be visiting the Crystal Lake Food Pantry to see where our food donations go.
- The Nursery is open for anyone who needs it.
