MY PRIORITIES AS A PASTOR

In the years I have served as a pastor, I have emphasized the following and I bring this approach to this church community:

• Your accessibility to me as needed.

• The importance of preaching which includes a close look at what is contained in the Bible and its applicability to our daily lives.

• Variety in worship. In preparing worship services, I draw on the resources of the United Church of Christ as well as available ecumenical resources from a variety of sources. In addition, I use church music and other music from a variety of sources as well.

• Providing educational opportunities for the congregation. I place a very strong emphasis on this. You can expect that I will be offering an educational program at least once a month.

• Working to get word out to both local and neighboring communities about what is happening in this church. This includes regular posting on Facebook and the use of other local media. I will post regularly on the church Facebook page as well as my own personal page.

• An invitational approach. This is connected with the outreach I describe above. I have always found it to be very important to get word out about what is happening in churches that I have served.

• Looking for opportunities to help make the church's presence known and to help engage the church in ways to be of help to those in need. Over my years in serving in churches, I have helped develop a variety of different programs, including benefit concerts and other means of reaching out to others.

• I am a native of Putnam and graduate of St. Mary's School and Marianapolis Prep.

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• I was raised Roman Catholic and was an ordained Permanent Deacon in the Catholic church from 1989-1998

- I have worked as a teacher, counselor, pastor and varsity basketball and baseball coach.

• I worked in the field of education for 43 years, including 30 years as a Counselor, in addition to my years of teaching.

• My undergraduate alma mater is Holy Cross. I am a loyal follower of their sports teams. My graduate degrees are from Boston College and Central Connecticut with my doctorate from Chicago Theological Seminary.

Hey everyone! We had our yearly inspection of our fire extinguishers. Two needed to be pressure tested and/or recharged which happens either every 6 or 12 years. Rather than doing these tests Wayne gave us two used extinguishers that already had testing done to them to save us money. After speaking with Wayne, this will be his final year doing this after 54 years of service. He will be sending out letters to his clients to let them know this and what road they can take next as a replacement.

I will be turning the water back on to the upstairs bathroom in the Parish House. I will leave it on if everything seems to be tightened and fixed. If I see any drips or leaks I will turn it back off and replace the proper plumbing parts.

Lastly, I sent out our Liability and Declaration insurance pages over to Anderson and Krause. They

The proposal is being written up and they will assess our properties/buildings. I will keep council informed and present what they offer hopefully next month.
